AN ACT TO

Direct the Department of Sexual Violence Prevention, with the Office of Technology and the Department of Records, to publish a single “Survivor Resources” hub on the official IUSG website.

Financial Impact: **None.**

Statute(s) Impacted: **None.**

Date Effective: **Upon Passage**

This bill represents the stance of the Indiana University student body as voiced through their elected representatives within the Indiana University Student Government (IUSG). It does not reflect the official position or endorsement of Indiana University as an institution, in accordance with IU policy GR-01 on contact with government officials.

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BE IT ENACTED *by the students of Indiana University
in Congress assembled:*

3 **SECTION 1. Title.**

4 This act may be cited as the “Survivor Resources Hub
5 Act.”

6 **SECTION 2. Purpose.**

7 1. To create and maintain a clear, accessible, and up-to-
8 date resource for survivors of sexual misconduct, and to
9 provide regular outcome reports to Congress.

10 2. This mandate aligns with the Department of Sexual
11 Violence Prevention's responsibility to support prevention,
12 survivor rights, and coordination of campus resources.

13 **SECTION 3. Survivor Resources Hub - Creation & 14 Ownership.**

15 1.The Department of Technology shall publish and host the Hub
16 on the IUSG website, ensuring it is easily accessible from the main
17 navigation bar.

18 A. The Department of Sexual Violence
19 Prevention is the content owner and is

- 20 responsible for accuracy, scope, and timely
21 updates.
- 22 B. The Department of Sexual Violence
23 Prevention shall coordinate with IU's Title
24 IX office and campus survivor-support units
25 to ensure accuracy and clarity.
- 26 C. The Office of the Student Body President, or
27 their designee, is responsible for the
28 safekeeping of IUSG records and will
29 archive versions of the Hub as needed for
30 institutional memory.

31 **SECTION 4. Minimum Content & Standards.**

32 1. Minimum content must include: crisis and emergency
33 contacts; confidential and non-confidential reporting
34 options; mental and physical healthcare ~~medical care~~;
35 academic accommodations; protective measures; legal and
36 advocacy services; how to report to IU and law
37 enforcement; campus policy links; FAQs in plain
38 language.

39 (a) The Hub must carry a clear "You are not alone /
40 immediate help" banner and an obvious path to
41 emergency assistance.

42 (b) No PII shall be collected on the Hub itself.

43 i. Any analytics must be strictly aggregated and
44 anonymized.

45 (c) The Hub must state that it provides information,
46 not legal advice.

47 **SECTION 5. Maintenance Requirements.**

48 1. The Department of Sexual Violence Prevention must review
49 content at least monthly during fall and spring semesters, at least
50 once during summer, and whenever IU policy, phone numbers, or
51 office links change.

52 (a) The page must show a visible "last updated"
53 timestamp.

54 (b) The Office of Technology shall ensure uptime
55 and functionality consistent with its general
56 website duties.

57 **SECTION 6. Marketing & Promotional Materials.**

58 1. To ensure that the Survivor Resources Hub reaches all
59 students and remains an active, visible resource, the
60 Department of Communications shall be tasked with
61 coordinating the marketing and public awareness
62 campaign for the initiative.

63 (a) The Department of Communications shall
64 design and implement marketing strategies,
65 including digital campaigns, social media
66 promotion, and collaborations with university media
67 channels, to inform students about the Hub and its
68 contents.

69 (b) The Department of Communications shall
70 coordinate with the Department of Sexual Violence
71 Prevention to ensure messaging is trauma-informed,
72 accessible, and survivor-centered.

73 (c) The Department of Communications shall also provide
74 the Department of Technology with marketing materials
75 suitable for inclusion on the IUSG homepage and other
76 relevant online platforms.

77 (d) At least once per semester, The Department of Sexual
78 Violence Prevention and the Department of
79 Communications shall jointly evaluate outreach
80 effectiveness and report summary outcomes in the
81 “Survivor Resources Outcomes Report” required under
82 Section 8 starting the semester of enactment.

83 **SECTION 7. Analytics & Routine Reporting.**

84 1. The Office of Technology shall enable aggregate
85 click/traffic analytics for the Hub.

86 2. At least once per month, during the first week of each month,
87 the Department of Technology shall include Hub traffic and
88 uptime metrics in its existing monthly report to the Speaker,
89 alongside other website reporting.

90 **SECTION 8. Timeline & Outcomes Report to**
91 **Congress.**

92 1. The Hub must go live within thirty (30) days of
93 enactment.

94 2. The Department of Sexual Violence Prevention shall deliver a
95 “Survivor Resources Outcomes Report” to Congress on the first
96 business day of every month, beginning two months after the
97 creation of the online hub.

98 (a) Content of the reports shall include:

- 99 i. Aggregate Hub metrics (page views,
100 unique visitors, navigation flows to IU
101 resource pages);
- 102 ii. Outreach and education activities
103 conducted by DSVP (trainings, tabling,
104 campaigns), and lessons learned;
- 105 iii. Identified information gaps, barriers to
106 access, and proposed fixes;
- 107 iv. Summary of interdepartmental
108 coordination and requests of Congress; and
- 109 v. Any budgetary implications or asks.

110 (b) Reports must exclude any details that could
111 identify a survivor.

112 (c) The Office of the Student Body President, or their
113 designee, shall publish the report to Congress’s
114 repository of records and maintain it for public
115 access.

116 **SECTION 9. Oversight.**

117 (1) The Congressional Committee on Equity & Justice may
118 hold a public review on the Hub and may request briefings
119 from the Department of Sexual Violence Prevention, the
120 Department of Technology, and the Office of the Student
121 Body President.

122 (2) The Congressional Steering Committee shall ensure that
123 the Department of Sexual Violence Prevention’s report is
124 placed on the agenda and distributed to Members in
125 accordance with the notice requirements.
