Established through legislation authored by Representative Louis Gallegos and passed by the Indiana University Student Government Congress, the Survivor Resources Hub is a centralized, survivor-centered digital resource on the IUSG website. This resource brings together reporting options, confidential support, Title IX information, medical care guidance, and both campus and community services in one place.

HIGHEST-IMPACT RECOMMENDATION

Institutionalize the Hub at the Orientation & Advising Level

Embedding the Hub into orientation and academic advising is the single most durable action O'Neill can take. Unlike a social media post or one-time email, these touchpoints are structured, repeated, and reach every student; not just those who happen to see a communication. Advisors who routinely reference the Hub during appointments, and orientation coordinators who include it in their programming, ensure that students know where to turn before they ever need to.

SIMPLE, LOW-LIFT STARTING POINTS

Include the Link Add the Hub URL to the next O'Neill newsletter or Canvas announcement; reachable in minutes with wide student impact.	Post in April Sexual Assault Awareness Month is this month. A single O'Neill social media post or email can amplify the Hub right now.	Add to Syllabi Encourage faculty to include a "Student Support Resources" section with the Hub link on every course syllabus going forward.
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
